Activity	Description	Funding cap	Tick if applicable
Stock-proof Fencing	Fencing to control grazing to allow regeneration to occur and improve groundcover. Boundary fencing is ineligible for funding.	\$6,000/km conventional, or \$3,000/km electric.	
Alternative stock watering points	Available where stock access to water is removed due to project work. Limited to a maximum of one alternate watering point per paddock affected.	\$1,500/trough, \$3,000/trough and tank or \$9,000/dam. Capped at \$9,000 per project.	
Revegetation	Supplementary tubestock planting.	\$5/tubestock capped at \$1,000 per project for site preparation, planting and maintenance of native tubestock. Local Land Services will supply seed and/or seedlings.	
Pest animal and weed control	Control in the project area.	Up to \$50/ha capped at \$1,500.	

Landholder eligibility checklist

Description	Check
Are you a NSW State Government employee, or applying on behalf of a NSW State Government agency?	
Do you, or the organisation you represent, have a conflict of interest?	
Have you previously had a project with Central West Local Land Services?	
Do you have any outstanding debt with Local Land Services (including rates)?	
Are you the land owner (title holder) or have you provided written permission from the land owner to apply for the funding?	
Do you agree to comply with the project standards for the duration of the 10-year agreement, beyond on-ground works?	
Do you agree to construct all new fences without barbed wire or aprons?	
Do you agree to have all on-ground project works completed by May 31, 2023 ?	

Applicants please note:

- Under the Local Land Services Act 2013, applicants who accept funding for project activities may be ineligible to use the funded activities or project sites in future proposals for clearing of Native Vegetation.
- Successful on-ground activities will be subject to a 10-year agreement from the completion of on-ground works.
- Funding availability is limited and is offered to landholders located in the identified priority areas.
- Non-payment of rates and other Local Land Services fees and accounts may result in application ineligibility.
- Landholders who receive incentive funding must agree to have a Cultural Heritage Survey on the project site. This will be organised by Central West Local Land Services staff, at no cost to the landholder. Identified Aboriginal heritage values will be registered on the Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS) and will need to be protected as part of the project.
