



AS A LANDHOLDER, CONTROLLING WILD DOGS IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

Biosecurity Risk

Wild dogs are a priority pest animal in the Hunter Region because of the negative impact they have on agricultural and natural environments. Wild dogs occur in all areas of NSW and have a large home range that include a number of holdings. Under the *NSW Biosecurity Act 2015* every landholder has a General Biosecurity Duty (GBD) to reduce risks caused by wild dogs by undertaking control activities.

How do I know if wild dogs are present?

To determine if wild dogs are present look for injury to animals caused by predation, missing or dead animals such as sheep, goats and calves, scats and tracks, visible sightings day and night, skittish animals and howling.
