

# Condition and utilisation report: January-March 2023

## North West Local Land Services | Travelling stock reserves

## Monitoring

#### Condition

48 condition assessments, including 5 Management Agreement Permits areas, were completed for the quarter with 67% in the 'Excellent' condition category. 6% of reserves were assessed as unsuitable for grazing.

#### Quarterly pasture growth rates

**Low - Moderate** in the western areas, particularly south of Walgett. Up to 500kg/ha in eastern section of the region.


#### \*Pasture biomass - Low - Moderate

Total standing dry matter up to 500 kgDM/ha (Aussie Grass).

\*North West Local Land Services targets a pasture biomass of 1200kgDM/ha or pasture utilisation levels above 10cm as suitable for grazing.


#### Ground cover - Good & Stable

Groundcover levels remain high and above critical thresholds across the region.

## Status of uses

Short term grazing permits - will only be allowed where enough groundcover and pasture biomass is available as determined by the travelling stock reserve (TSR) Ranger.

Roadside grazing permits - North West Local Land Services permits roadside grazing use

after the stock owner receives approval from the local Council. (Please note: Roadside Grazing Permits attract a permit fee)

Routine Stock Movements permits (RSMP) - permits remain in place.

**Management Agreement Permits** – remain in place.

Walking Stock permits – Increased to a maximum 1,000 dry cattle or 6,000 dry sheep. More information available <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a> or www.lls.nsw.gov.au/regions/north-west.
