
# Travelling Stock Reserves Report | North West LLS Region

# October 2023

## Summary

- Ground cover and pasture biomass levels remain moderate to good, with a decreasing trend in the west of the region.
- Energy level and nutritive value of pasture is very low and not able to maintain condition on cattle.
- 90-day rainfall remains well below average with the majority of the region in drought status
- All permit types are still available to access TSR, however some sections are now not suitable for walking stock due to fragmented low pasture levels along the network.
- Stock walking permits have decreased whilst a strong demand remains for short term and roadside grazing uses.

# **TSR Condition**

- 28 condition assessments were completed in October 2023 with 31% of reserves assessed as not suitable for grazing.
- Most reserves in moderate condition.

## **Key Activities**

- **Significant windmill repair** operations after damaging winds.
- Initiation of St John's Wort control in the Liverpool Plains, Tamworth and Gunnedah shires.
- Mimosa bush management in the Moree district.
- Facilitating access to feed for local grazing and walking stock.
- Compliance activities for unauthorised usage.
