All applications will require the applicants to complete the Monitoring Score Card’s for natural asset management and business competencies (see Factsheet for more information) at the beginning and at the completion of a project.

**How much funding is available?**

Each project is competitively ranked against other potential projects outcomes. Projects with landholder in-kind contribution will be assessed more favourably. The landholder contribution can include in-kind labour contribution.

**What funding activities aren’t funded?**

Activities NOT funded include statutory weed and pest animal control; weed control where a current long-term NWLLS grazing permit extends; boundary and exclusion fencing; clearing of native vegetation.

**How long do I have to complete my project?**

Depending on the activities some projects may have scope to be completed by 2023. This will be assessed per application.

**How will my project be assessed?**

All applications will be ranked based on criteria that includes:

- Number of entities engaged (for group projects)
- Number of project outcomes that are addressed (see Part 4)
- Cost per hectare
- Overall cost and in-kind contribution of the project
- How it contributes to improved soil health, threatened or endangered ecological communities, Ramsar wetland condition and habitat for threatened species
