Riverina Local land Services would like to invite you to enter the 2022/23 'The magic of Wiradjuri Country' photo competition.

The aim of this competition is to bring together amateur photographers from across the Riverina to capture what they see as the magic of the land we live on.

### How it works

- Both primary and secondary schools can participate.
- There's no right or wrong focus for the photograph -to some, a landmark, an animal, a person, or even the landscape itself may be what catches their eve.
- Students will submit their entries to the school who are responsible for choosing the top three photos and submitting them to Riverina Local Land Services for region wide judging.
- The winning photographers will be awarded prizes during Reconciliation Week 2023.
- All contributing photographers will be acknowledged along with their school and all entries will be showcased at local libraries throughout the Riverina during 2023.

You can start promoting this to your students and having them take photos.


### By 30 April 2023

# **Terms and Conditions**

- Original photographs to be submitted using photographs taken from a camera or smart phone.
- Photographer must be a current student at the school.
- Only electronic copies of photographs must be submitted.
- In order to be suitable for publication, photographs must be of high resolution in JPEG (.jpg) format. The file needs to be a minimum 2,000 pixels on longest side for website uploads and a maximum 3,000 pixels at max 10MB in size.
