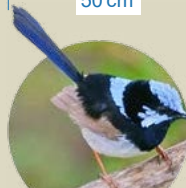

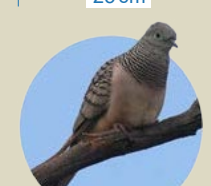

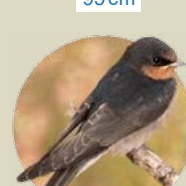

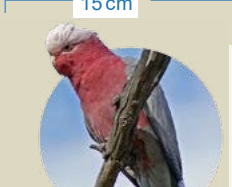

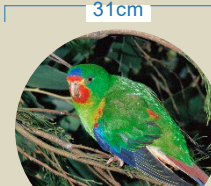

You can assist our threatened species or measure the health of the environment by understanding what birds occur in your local garden or on the farm and also measure how an area of bushland is recovering from fire or drought, or simply how healthy an environment might be, by recording what bird species you see. Follow these simple steps to take part in a simple bird survey:

- 1 Tick the birds as you see them
- 2 Add any extra birds you see in the spaces provided
- 3 Date the form and keep it as your own record or perhaps submit the survey to a citizen science database, such as Birdata or Bionet (iNaturalist), that is recording bird sightings across Australia
